What?

- NSF has partnered with the National Institutes of Health to use SciENcv: Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae as an NSF-approved format for use in preparation of the Biosketch and Current and Pending support sections of an NSF proposal.
- SciENcv will produce NSF-compliant PDF versions of the Biosketch and Current and Pending support formats. Proposers must save this document and submit it as part of their proposal via Research.gov.

Why and when?

- Beginning October 23, 2023, the NSF Fillable PDF option will go away and the SciENcv formats will be required.
 - Biosketch
 - Current and Pending
- Adoption of a single, common researcher profile system for federal grants reduces administrative burden for researchers.

- National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI)
 - Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae (SciENcv)
 - https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/sciencv/
 - A researcher profile system for all individuals who apply for, receive or are associated with research investments from federal agencies. SciENcv is available in My NCBI.

- Open Researcher and Contributor Identifier (ORCiD)
 - https://info.orcid.org/what-is-orcid/
 - ORCiD is a "non-profit, community-driven effort to create and maintain a registry of unique researcher identifiers and a transparent method of linking research activities and outputs to these identifiers"
